PGMOODLE UPGRADE

What is happening?

PG Moodle will be upgraded to the most recent version.

Why is this happening?

It will improve the user experience for all users by providing a stable platform with new features and improvements, and also a number of fixes for security vulnerabilities. Furthermore, the new Moodle site will be compliant with the current GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation).

When is this happening?

Date	Action
Monday 7 January 2019 @ 8:00am	The service will be taken offline and the upgrade process will begin.
Tuesday 8 January 2019	The service will stay offline and the upgrade process will be completed.
Wednesday 9 January 2019 @ 9:00am	PGMoodle will be back online. Users can access the service.

We do not anticipate any problems once PG Moodle is back online. However as with any upgrade there be may be a risk of unexpected issues popping up. Please be patient if this happens.

What is the impact?

Users will not be able to access the service once it goes offline on the 7th and 8th January 2019.

What precautions should I take?

Before the downtime happens you could take a few precautions:

- Download/save all your feedback related to the latest submission.
